Definitely get teched ahead of time, you will waste a lot of time doing it at the track and pay extra like Jerry said plus if you fail, you'll have to fix whatever it is and then start all over. I used to go to Bugformance in east San Jose to get mine done but I don't know if they are still in business and are still doing them. I also remember Art at Autopoint doing one for me once. Should only take about 10 minutes.

Plan on spending alot of time in meetings at the track, especially HPDE1&2. You have tons to learn and

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they are going to cover most everything so kiss the wife and kids goodbye in the morning and plan on realistically seeing them again at lunch and just a few minutes during the day.
