The NASA CCR would regulate this, and it says surprisingly little about seats. Tube frame seats are a verboten, and back braces are required for non-FIA seats. Fire proof material may be an issue on the GT3 setas, but you should be technically legal.

Well how fire "proof" are dash material or interior bits allowed to remain in general? I can't tell from either NASA or PCA what the ruling would be on the seat. Who in NASA would make the ultimate decision? The seat isn't leather, it's perlon I think its called. Sort of like the material used on the inside of helmets...a foamy breathable material. If I could post a pic, I'd show the seat but the sites not letting me for some reason.

The CCR only lists it being "recommended" that fire resistant material be used. My suggestion would be to look through the CCR, and then ask your local tech inspector - the chief tech inspector in your region has final say, as the CCR is a NASA ruleset, not controlled by 944 Spec.
