Hi Sean, since you already have the 88 block and head you are off to a good start.

lindsey does have all the nessasary parts but keep in mind you can only use OEM Porsche pistons in the stock size. We are not allowed to bore our engines at all. So all you really need are therings and bearings and a local shop to rebuild the bottom end.

if you have not tore the engine apart yet then do a leak down and compression test. If both check fine vou may be able to just do bearings. Pull the head and inspect for any serious scoring of the cylinder walls especially at the top of the stroke. Some blocks are not usable.

do not allow the engine rebuilder to hone the cylinders at all. Only a light scuffing with a Scotch Brite pad in needed. The cylinder walls are coated and a special process must be used that very few are aware of. All of my rebuilt engines have used pistons in them.

the important piece of the puzzel is the head. It must be done by a competent rebuilder like Milledge Or others. The setup of the valve train is important for HP and longevity.

be sure to ask lots of questions, we will answer them or send you in the right direction.

Be very fussy with crank tolerances, as well.
