They tend to last guite a long time in racing cars. My gearboxes use the early mounts and mine are original never replaced. Engine mounts do wear over time and get replaced during initial engine build or rod bearing change. Then they tend to last 5 years or more. Not big maintince issue. I have been racing my 944 spec for nearly 10 years and have been tracking it for 11 years. Most of the parts just last and last.
